I- Baza-Education Activities 2015-2016 in Kouma Konda sponsored by Aegis Living

1. Building and Inauguration of a toilet facility in Kouma Konda
2. Implementation of Baza Education in the locality
3. Purchased of a TV Set and repaired of broken school desks

1- Building and Inauguration of a toilet facility in Kouma Konda

A-Technical specs toilet facility that was built

- Standard 8 people at time: 4 for girls and 4 for boys latrines, 2 holes in 1 room.
- Accumulation rate 0.038 meter³ / year / person
- Filling time 3 years maximum then switch to the second one. Switch back and forth for every three years. Use the decaf was fertilizer for the farmers
- Minimum useful volume $3 \times 10 \times 0.038 \times 3 = 1.15$ meter³
- Useful Depth 1.25 meter
- Minimum Depth 1.5 meter

B- Detailed description of the componants of the toilet facility

Pit: a wall that divides the pit into two equal parts separates it. The wall rises to the level of the base and is plastered. The dimensions of the pit are 1.40 m x 1.45 m. The depth is at least 1.5 m. • the underbody: It is made in blocks of 15 full. This underbody serves as a support for 3 the slabs. It is built all on 5cm of concrete metered at 250 kg / m³ (that is 50kg of cement for 170 liters Gravel and 80 liters of sand). The base is made with 2 layers of cinder blocks. To prevent the rain buckets from entering the latrines, an embankment is placed all around the substructure with a slope of about 3% to the outside of the latrines. • The slab: The slabs are eight (8). They are metered at 350 kg / m³ (50 kg of cement for 120 liters of gravel and 60 liters of sand). For construction and reinforcement details, please refer to the accompanying execution drawings.

C- Inauguration OF the new Toilet facilities

6 November 2016 we did the inauguration of our new toilet facility at Kouma Konda. We were honored by the presence of the village chief. We had the choir of the village church sang at the event. The students and the villagers were happy.

2-Implementation of Baza Education programs

A-Description

Baza Education officially opened classes on Saturday January 30, 2016 in its localities in Togo. The tutor's orientations and training session have been held the weekend before; it was a successful event. We chose our new students in exam classes based on the report card of 2015; also we had the assistance of teachers who provided us with the list of students in need both academically and financially in 2016.

A special attention has been given to the students who are in exam classes and preparing for state examinations

The local committee distributed school supplies to our orphan's students.

During the year our tutors had taught every Saturday for 5 hours and some Wednesday afternoon for 2 hours. They also provided one on one tutoring and coaching with the students that had been identified as falling behind in their academics.

Our classes were closed right before state exam on June 13, 2016 and the results of the exam were in at the end of July 2016. The money provided by Aegis Living was used to pay for 3 tutors, 1 coordinator, and schools supplies for 52 students in 2 villages.

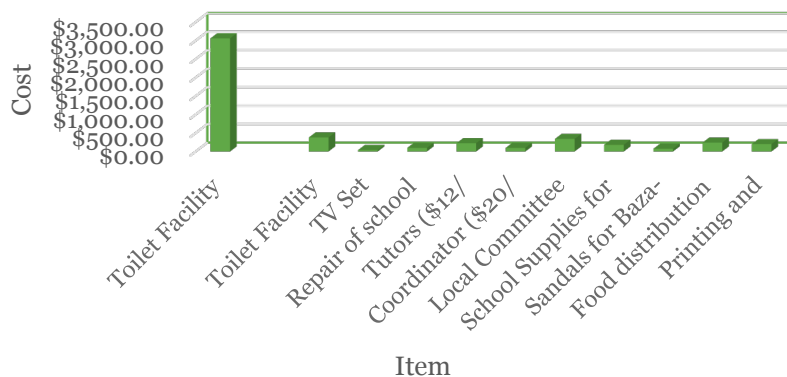
